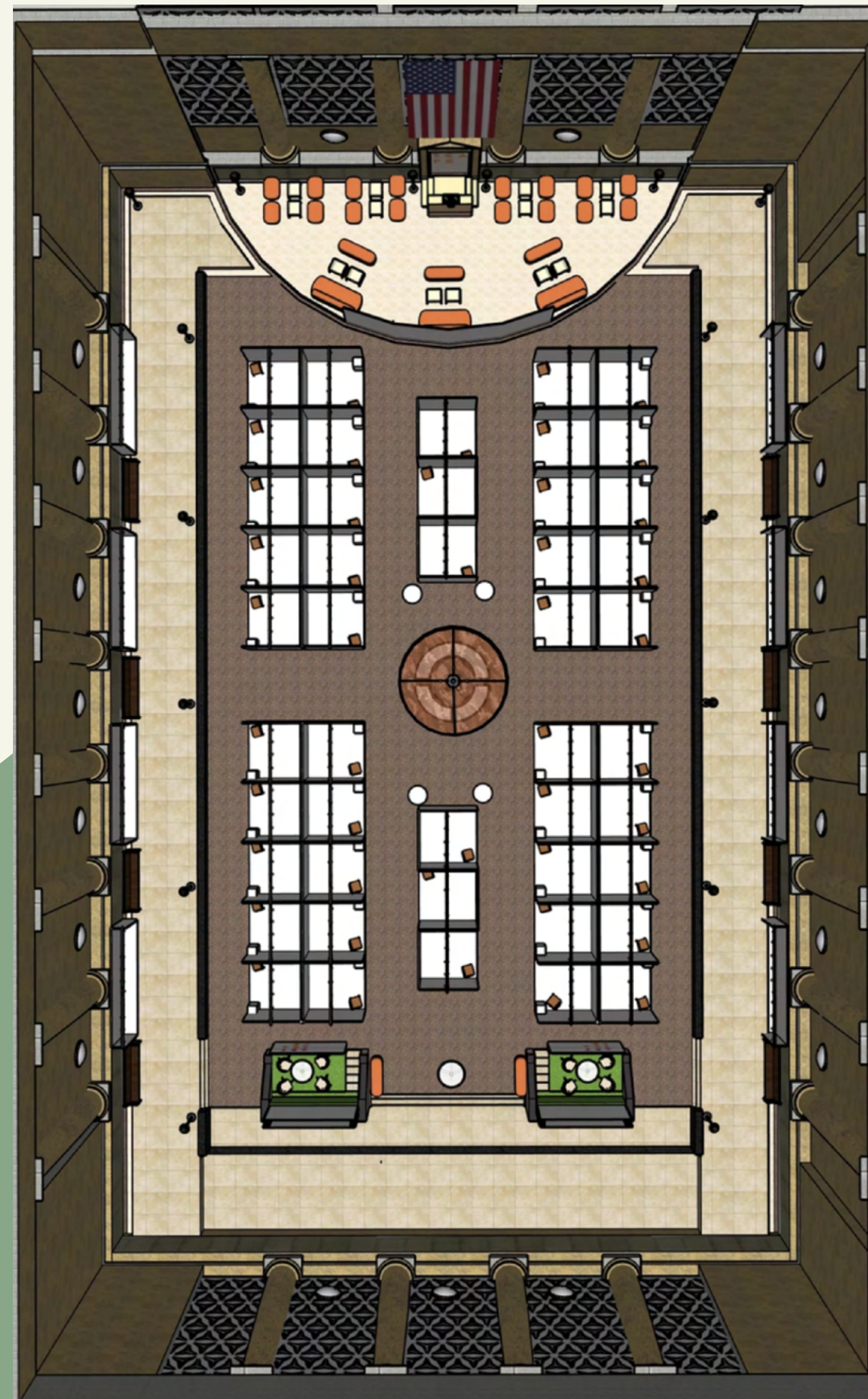
## **DERRICK ADAMS**
